So, the High Holy Days have ended – we have celebrated Sukkot and Simchat Torah. Time to take a break, a breather, right? Well, that's not completely right! While things will begin to "slow down" a bit for now, we do have a busy winter ahead (including Hanukkah) and of course the Spring holy days coming quickly as well. The Jewish cal-

endar provides for us very little time to "relax." Just when we think it is time to catch our breath, the next holiday or holy day comes on very fast!

Truthfully, though, being Jewish is exactly that – we do not really have time to take a break. We live our lives according to the messages we glean from our Torah and other holy books. At the root of all of this is how we treat each other. After all, Tikkun Olam, a phrase quite often used today, is all about taking care of the world and everyone in it. We have so much work to do here at Temple Beth Shalom and in Ocala. We will fight for women's reproductive rights; we will fight for equality for all people; we will fight to ensure our children have the best and the most inclusive education; we will fight for everyone to have the same rights!
