Shalom Y'all!

Temple Beth Shalom is a community made up of a variety of types of people. Sometimes, it is hard to look out in our congregation and find the many ways we are the same or even recognize the things we have in common. Well, let me tell you one way in which we are alike. I would guess that every one of us has at some point in their life struggled with balance. I am

going to purposefully not define that word. For each of us, it may mean something different. Maybe we are unable to find the balance in our personal lives; still, others have difficulties finding balance in their professional lives. And there are still those who (like me) are challenged by finding a balance between their personal AND professional lives. Personally, as I find myself trying to do more and more for my congregation, I wonder if I am taking away from my roles as husband and aba.

If you think about it, balance is something many of us will struggle with our entire lives. This is nothing new. We find a lack of balance all over – from our modern day lives all the way back to our roots: the *TaNaKh*. In the *Torah*, we find a chronology of men and women who struggled greatly with their roles as fathers, mothers, brothers, sisters, etc. Beginning with Adam and Eve, we find example after example of Biblical characters that for one reason or another were unable to find balance. Throughout our history, the Jews have always searched for the how and why...and unfortunately have never really been able to find it.

Is it so bad though? Is it really our end goal to find that balance? Or is it our challenges and searching that helps us to understand? Certainly there are questions we have that will never be answered. And, while this may cause us frustration, we are able to keep looking and reflecting; just maybe we will catch a glimpse of that balance we so desperately seek. I try to dwell less on balance and more on what is important to me, my family, and my community. If we imagine ourselves standing on one foot (as Hillel did so long ago), we should also imagine our desire to find balance. However, when we stand on two feet, we have that balance – until something comes along and knocks us out of balance.

Friends and family – seek balance for sure. However, do not lose yourself in the search. Find something that gives you comfort or temporary balance. Then, allow life to happen...sometimes you might find that the surprise is that our lack of balance actually keeps us balanced!

The board spent most of the November meeting discussing this issue as well as when should we hire a sheriff? We all agreed every Shabbat and our monthly Saturday service is a given. Do we hire a sheriff for the comedian, a memorial/Shiva service, the fashion show, every night of Chanukah that we have a congregation candle lighting, Seder? By now you get how the November board meeting went!

The decision was made to enact the security assessment that is in our bylaws. What this means is every family will be billed 150.00 on January 1st. Understand, this assessment is for one year. Our hope is to apply for grants etc. so we won't have to do this yearly. We need more volunteers to help with chairs when we have events, please volunteer.

Board Highlights



TAX BENEFITS FROM YOUR RMD

The IRA charitable rollover (also called a Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD) is a smart-tax way to support the Temple. The IRS has declared that charitable donations made directly from one of your tax-deferred accounts will be exempt from taxation up to \$100,000 as long as the distribution comes from a qualified account and is donated to a charity that meets the IRS stipulation.

Temple Beth Shalom meets the requirements. This means that a Temple member who has a tax-deferred account and must take a Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) may request the custodian of the account to send directly to the Temple whatever amount they request, and that payment will count toward the required distribution, but that amount will not be considered taxable income. This is a great way to make a donation, pay your dues, satisfy your RMD, and reduce your taxes at the same time.
