Shalom Y'all!

Every summer, I am blessed with the opportunity to spend 2 weeks at URJ Camp Coleman – the URJ's Southeast Regional camp. As I grew up at Camp Coleman (camper in the 80's and staff in the 90's and 2000's), it has been a homecoming for me every summer since 2013. The ages of the campers range from 8-15 and there are even opportunities to be involved with Camp Coleman way beyond 15. This summer, Batya and I were so

incredibly thankful to have all 3 of our children at camp - 2 as campers and 1 as a staff member.

One of my responsibilities while at camp is teaching an elective to several of the older units at camp. While teaching 14 year old campers in the Kesher Unit, I was amazed and truly inspired by some of the comments that were made. I was teaching a class on the aftermath of October 7, 2023 – and how the world (including Israel) has responded. Of course, this required some explanation and discussion regarding what the kids have heard and/or seen, especially in social media.

I was blown away by the fact that many of these campers had experienced real acts of antisemitism directed at them and their families. One camper reported that she was told by one of her classmates, "Too bad Hitler didn't finish the job..." Some of the comments were downright disgusting and clearly meant to hurt and or intimidate. One camper even reported of their complete fear of being alone in one of her classes with some of her classmates.

The most important lesson I could teach these campers began with education. One of the biggest reasons why it may seem at times that the world is completely against the Jewish community is due primarily to a lack of education. Words such as "Apartheid" and "Genocide" are thrown around or at Israel. And God forbid we defend Israel against these attacks – that just makes us the target of the hate and terrorizing. So, we take one step at a time – we learn our history and the history of all of those that live in the Land of Israel. We learn what these flagrant words mean when they are thrown at us, and we understand the truth...not something we see on social media – but something we know from facts.

I will close out my article with a comment that was shared with me – one that gives me a bit of hope for the future. This was said to me by one of the Israeli staff members at camp: "Israel has a lot of work to do to be the kind of nation we know it can be – but being with these amazing campers at Camp Coleman has given me a lot of hope for what that future will look like."

My nursing school began in Israel and completed in Baltimore. While in nursing school in Baltimore, I was working in my father's grocery stores running the front end. I still wonder how I was able to manage it all.

A career change brought me to Conyers, GA to manage the Human Resources department of a loan company. What a culture shock! I didn't know a soul outside of work and my children. I became an active member board member, Ritual Chair and Education Director at Temple Beth David in Snellville, GA.

I married Darrell in 2017 (the 3rd for both of us) extending our family to 4 children and 2 fabulous granddaughters.

How did we end up in Ocala? Funny you should ask. Darrell and I knew we wanted to move to Florida. We wanted to find a location that was quiet. We were on our way home from vacationing in Cocoa Beach when I asked Darrell to follow the On Top Of The World billboard signs to Ocala. We loved the area so much we decided to make Ocala our home in Calesa Township.

As I stated above, TBS has become our home. I believe teamwork, compassion, motivation, and strong leadership, has made TBS what it is today. I look forward to meeting each of you and hearing your ideas on making TBS even greater! Please feel free to reach out to me.

Sisterhood honors Annette Zuckerman, age 100

The End of the year luncheon held on Wednesday, June 5, at the Country Club of Ocala. As one of our Past Presidents, Annette Zuckerman, is turning 100 years young in August, Sisterhood invited Annette and her daughter, Sue Grossman, to be our honored guests at this luncheon. Annette was not able to attend but we took a group photo, attached it to a card which all in attendance signed. A couple of weeks later, several members went, to visit her and to bring the card and photo.

Annette was born in Brooklyn, Annette Leah Belmont, on 8/24/1924. She married her childhood sweetheart, David. After he returned from the Marines, they moved to MA where they raised their son, Kenneth and daughter, Susan. David was a camera repairman and had his own business in which Annette was a major help. In 1953, they lived through a tornado by sheltering in the cellar/basement of their home but it caused them to lose everything. Some belongings were found later, blown 40 miles away. In addition to helping in David's business Annette worked on the first computers, the size of a room, worked as a data transcriber for the US Census Bureau and in an IBM installation. She helped develop a photo slide system for Quest Inc.

Annette loved Mahjong and played with her friends and in competitions in the Catskills. She and David travelled the world. David would take photo slides. Annette would put them to music and do the commentary to accompany the 2 projector show. They would perform all over New England in Grange Halls and the like. Annette would cook the foods of the countries they visited.

She took classes in conversational Italian, Spanish, Greek and Biblical Hebrew. She sang as a child and as a teen performed in Carnegie Hall and on the radio. She was involved at her Temple in Worcester, MA. She was an artist in many mediums as well as a decorator, sculptor, gardener, seamstress and knitter. Annette would bake elaborate cakes, such as a Cannon camera with a flash attachment, a three-ring circus, etc. She was a Scout leader and was very involved in her children's lives.

After 35 years of marriage she and David were divorced. When Susan and her husband, Nathan Grossman, MD, moved to Ocala so he could become the Health Director for Marion County, Annette helped remodel their home. One day she visited Clearwater Beach and decided to move there. She went home, sold her home and moved to Oldsmar, FL and worked for the Golda Meir Center as an Executive Secretary. Around 1989, she was diagnosed with cancer. Her life was saved at the Moffit Center after which she moved to Ocala. She would often visit her son Kenneth' and his family in California.

In Ocala she worked for the City department of Parks and Recreation as a Secretary in their Senior Centers. She also volunteered at Temple Beth Shalom as Secretary and was involved in the Sisterhood for which she served a President in 1994. She became a Bat Mitzvah at age 74 with her granddaughter, Mitzi. For her 90th birthday she traveled to California and went with the entire family to Yellowstone National Park.



This year the family will come to her. Annette has 2 children, three granddaughters and 6 great grandchildren.
