Shalom Y'all,

When I write welcome notes to new members, I always refer to the Temple Beth Shalom family. Each and every one of us is a part of this family. All of us have equal voices, wants and desires. For the first time in my career as a rabbi, I find myself part of a congregational family that truly includes my family – from those checking in on us after we dropped Carlie off at college to those who

brought cards and a cake in honor of Batya's birthday. Temple Beth Shalom is a wonderful family – and each and every one of us should feel blessed.

We are now in the month of Elul, the period in which we think about the previous year, the mistakes we made, and the changes we would like to make to be better selves in the future. What I am focusing on this month is looking inwardly at the ways in which I may be a better person, friend, father, husband, and rabbi. Sometimes, being a rabbi is very lonely. This is one of the main reasons why I go to CCAR conventions and why I work at Camp Coleman (with my colleagues/friends) every year.

For example, when I write poetry and/or prayers about personal experiences, such as my Mom's birthday on August 22, I have to understand the difference between being a "friend" and/or being "friendly." After all, I am an employee of Temple Beth Shalom – regardless of how close I become to the members of this amazing family.

What I can say for sure is we have found our home – our family here in Ocala, Florida. As time moves on, and our relationships deepen with you, I am still your rabbi, and I need to be able to be the rabbi you need and expect of me. This is my challenge – and one I am absolutely blessed to face every day. As we approach the new year, 5785, let me share with you one of my prayers:

Open your eyes today and look around. See every nook and cranny present in the world. Make sure you do not miss even the smallest detail. Observe all that you may have missed before.

Listen with open ears to every sound present. Hear the birds, the insects, the distant sounds of children. Take it all in - even the sounds that may have seem annoying before. Perceive what each sound means to you, today.
