Dearest TBS Family,

I am going to tell you a secret. Many people do not know or understand the secret I am about to tell you, but I hope you get it. Ready: Rabbis are people too. That's right; we experience joy, happiness and wonder. We also experience grief, sadness and tragedy. One of the many things I hear from congregants is, "Wow, I do not know how you are able to go from an extremely high time to an extremely low time, sometimes in

the same day. I couldn't do it..." You know what? It is NOT easy. However, one of the most important aspects of being a rabbi is the need to be *human*. I do cry; I do jump for joy. When celebrating a joyous life cycle event with congregants, I am often soooooo overwhelmingly overjoyed. And, the opposite is true too – when helping congregants deal with the emotions of pain, I often feel pain. So, how am I able to be strong during these moments? How am I able to help congregants gain clarity when it seems impossible? Because, I, too, have experienced pain, grief and tragedy.

You see, my mother, z"l, died in 2004 after a hard fought battle with breast cancer. I was 28. I had been married for a little over 2 years. Batya and I had not begun to even think about having kids yet. I was a technology teacher in Fulton County. I had worked as a middle school teacher for several years before that – in public, private and religious school. When mom died, I really struggled with God...where was God? Ultimately, it was my strong faith in God and my love for Judaism that allowed me to get through those very dark moments – especially the first High Holy Day period. During the first Yizkor service, I was lost. I could not make sense of what happened. However, it was during my struggles that I decided to finally pursue rabbinical school at HUC-JIR. I recognized that my pain was not abnormal or strange. It was a pain that many people before and after had and would experience. I realized that my way of dealing with my own struggles would be to help others deal with theirs. And, you know what? I knew this before Mom died. It was her final battle with breast cancer that pushed me over the edge - that pushed me that final step toward accomplishing my life goal of becoming a rabbi.

Ultimately, it is the battles we face in life that help to shape us. It is these battles and struggles that help us grow and become the individuals we are. However, it is not just the battles. Our wins, our glorious moments, our celebrations – these also help shape us. It is during our struggles, though, that we lose sight of the wonder. So, some people make it our life's work (you see this is not a job, but a life style) to help each other and all of our congregants and really anyone we come across who needs it. Maybe you have something you need to get off of your chest or are struggling with. As the saying goes, "My door is always open..."

The President's Message

Board Meeting Tuesday, December 10 at 6:30 PM

It has been 14 months since we witnessed one of the worst acts of terrorism the world has seen. Jews have been targets of hatred and antisemitism for thousands of years, and through the power of the media, the world witnessed what we have always been up against. We must never forget how fragile our heritage is, and we must never stop moving forward as a religion and a people. Since the events of October 7, 2023, the Jewish people and the State of Israel continually fight for our rights to freely practice our religion and the existence of the Jewish State. Even though the war exists thousands of miles away, antisemitism is at an all-time worldwide high, and as a congregation, we must be diligent in protecting ourselves.

We find it necessary to hire deputy sheriff personnel for all our services, in order to keep us safe, which comes at a financial cost. Many members have generously donated additional funds along with their monthly dues to help finance our security needs. Sadly, we cannot foresee an end to this burden that has been put upon us, and we must continually rely on the support of our members. I realize the economy has hurt all of us, but I would like to ask those who can afford to help us to be as generous as possible.

We are closing out the year with many upcoming events on our calendar. Look through the temple website's "Events" section for all we offer. Historically, Jews spend Christmas watching movies and eating Chinese food; not this year, it's Chanukah! Mazel Tov. Remember to join us on December 27th for Chanukah Shabbat and participate in our celebration at 6:30 P.M. BYOM-Bring Your Own Menorah to help Light up the Night. Volunteers are needed to make/buy latkes, donuts, applesauce, sour cream etc. Please contact Stephen Zuckerman or Susan Ahern and let them know what you plan to bring.

While we are celebrating, it's important to remember not all people are as fortunate as us, and no child should be without a toy during the holiday season. Our annual toy drive is in full swing, and along with UCC, we are collecting new unwrapped toys to be delivered to children throughout Marion County. There are boxes in the lobby for your donations. Please bring your toy to the temple before Monday, December 9. Let's help put smiles on the faces of as many children as possible.

TAX BENEFITS FROM YOUR RMD

The IRA charitable rollover (also called a Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD) is a smart-tax way to support the Temple. The IRS has declared that charitable donations made directly from one of your tax-deferred accounts will be exempt from taxation up to \$100,000 as long as the distribution comes from a qualified account and is donated to a charity that meets the IRS stipulation.

Temple Beth Shalom meets the requirements. This means that a Temple member who has a tax-deferred account and must take a **Required Minimum Distribution** (RMD) may request the custodian of the account to send directly to the Temple whatever amount they request, and that payment will count toward the required distribution, but that amount will not be considered taxable income. This is a great way to make a donation, pay your dues, satisfy your RMD, and reduce your taxes at the same time.

On October 23, members of the Book Club met to discuss "Not Our Kind," a book of fiction which dealt with issues of both anti-Semitism and independence. We were all able to relate to both of these issues. While the actual story is a bit obvious the underlying themes were worthy of discussion. In our next meeting on December 18, we'll be discussing the last book of this year, "Hotel Cuba" by Aaron Hamburger. This book deals with several topics as well: emigration, discrimination, family and courage. The book is available on kindle, in paperback as well as hardcover.

Fleeing the chaos of World War I and the terror of the Soviet Revolution, practical, sensible Pearl Kahn and her lovestruck, impulsive younger sibling Frieda sail for America to join their sister in New York. But discriminatory new immigration laws bar their entry, and the young women are turned back at Ellis Island. With few options, Pearl and Frieda head for Havana, Cuba, convinced they will find a way to overcome this setback.

At first, life in big-city Prohibition-era Havana is overwhelming, like nothing Pearl and Frieda have ever experienced—or could have ever imagined in the rural shtetl where they grew up. As the sisters begin to adjust, their plans for going to America together become complicated. Frieda falls for the not-so-dreamy man of her dreams while Pearl's life opens up unexpectedly, offering her a taste of freedom and heady romance, and an opportunity to build a future on her own terms. A heartbreaking, epic family story, Hotel Cuba explores the profound courage of two women displaced from their home who strive to create a new future in an enticing and dangerous world far different from anything they have ever known.
