Dearest TBS Family,

I was recently watching an episode of Marvel's "Agents of Shield." In the episode, the main character, Agent Coulson has just ordered a bunch of physical and medical tests for himself. Although all of the tests came back normal, he remarks that he just feels different. Earlier in his life, he actually was killed and brought back to life. The specifics are not important...but

the fact that he has a scar from where he died is a constant reminder that he can never truly go back...but he can move forward.

The exact quote from the show is, "The point of these things (the scar) is to remind us that there is no going back. There's only moving forward." Every one of us experiences some kind of trauma in our lives. When we experience these events, we definitely change. Some of us change physically (as in scars), while others change emotionally. Ultimately, it is how we grow and progress in our lives that matters. For some, the changes are minor while others go through drastic life changes.

As a community, we carry the responsibility and honor/blessing to be a support for each other. When we experience changes in our lives, it is wonderful to know that we have a community of support to fall back on. Just as important, however, is our need to recognize when others need our support. Sometimes, all it takes is a phone call or a visit to affect the lives of our family. These should be ongoing occurrences. You never know when and how these gestures will change the lives of others.

Today, tomorrow and anytime you can – pick up the phone and call someone in the congregation. Check in on them and how their day is going. Get in your car and go pay someone a visit. Going for coffee? Grab a 2nd cup and take it one of your friends or family in the TBS family. If someone does something nice for you – say thank you – and then turn around and do something nice for someone else. This kind of behavior – so necessary – can be contagious!!!

TAX BENEFITS FROM YOUR RMD

The IRA charitable rollover (also called a Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD) is a smart-tax way to support the Temple. The IRS has declared that charitable donations made directly from one of your tax-deferred accounts will be exempt from taxation up to \$100,000 as long as the distribution comes from a qualified account and is donated to a charity that meets the IRS stipulation.

Temple Beth Shalom meets the requirements. This means that a Temple member who has a tax-deferred account and must take a **Required Minimum Distribution** (RMD) may request the custodian of the account to send directly to the Temple whatever amount they request, and that payment will count toward the required distribution, but that amount will not be considered taxable income. This is a great way to make a donation, pay your dues, satisfy your RMD, and reduce your taxes at the same time.



There has been some confusion about DIRECTED donations at Temple Beth Shalom. Sisterhood's Bimah Flower/camp scholarship fund goes only to honor Simchot. The Temple's Tree of Life also goes only for Simchot.

Sisterhood sells Uniongrams, has YES Fund cards and TREE certificates for trees in Israel which can be purchased for Simchas or remembrance. The Temple has prayer book dedications and accepts contributions to many funds which can be made for any type of occasion. The Temple also has Memorial Plaques and accepts Yahrzeit donations only in remembrance of a deceased loved one. Members who wish to donate for something specific must select one of the appropriate destinations for their money.
