Dearest TBS Family,

On Monday, February 25, I entered into a Holocaust replica cattle car for the "Hate Ends Now" exhibit. It was truly a moving experience. I have toured Holocaust exhibits and museums all around the world, including the Holocaust Memorial in Washington, DC and Yad Vashem in Jerusalem. Every experience has impacted my life and my Jewishness. However, the

"Hate Ends Now" exhibit touched me in a way I was not expecting.

Before I entered the cattle car exhibit, I walked into the OTLS Social Hall to examine several tables of Holocaust items. There were two items that specifically spoke to me. The first, an anti-Black poster, was something I had never seen before. While I know Jews were not the only victims of the Nazi Regime, this poster was new to me. It was a reminder how hate affects all people, Jews and non-Jews alike.

The second item was a "Hitler Alarm Clock." What was most surprising to me was that the item was created in the United States, in Connecticut. It only goes to remind us of how little Americans knew during the 1930's and 1940's. Sure, there were many in the U.S. government, including the president, who knew what was going on. However, it would seem to appear that the everyday citizen did not know or understand the depth of the atrocities being committed in Europe.

It seems that there is a deep seated hatred in the world today...here in the United States and beyond. The "Hate Ends Now" exhibit teaches us we all have a very important role in fighting against the hatred of the past. If we do not learn from the mistakes of the past, we are certainly doomed to repeat it. May God give us the strength and fortitude to really live the biblical statement: *V'ahavtah Lereiacha Kamocha*, "Love your neighbor as yourself."

TAX BENEFITS FROM YOUR RMD

The IRA charitable rollover (also called a Qualified Charitable Distribution or QCD) is a smart-tax way to support the Temple. The IRS has declared that charitable donations made directly from one of your tax-deferred accounts will be exempt from taxation up to \$100,000 as long as the distribution comes from a qualified account and is donated to a charity that meets the IRS stipulation.

Temple Beth Shalom meets the requirements. This means that a Temple member who has a tax-deferred account and must take a **Required Minimum Distribution** (RMD) may request the custodian of the account to send directly to the Temple whatever amount they request, and that payment will count toward the required distribution, but that amount will not be considered taxable income. This is a great way to make a donation, pay your dues, satisfy your RMD, and reduce your taxes at the same time.


